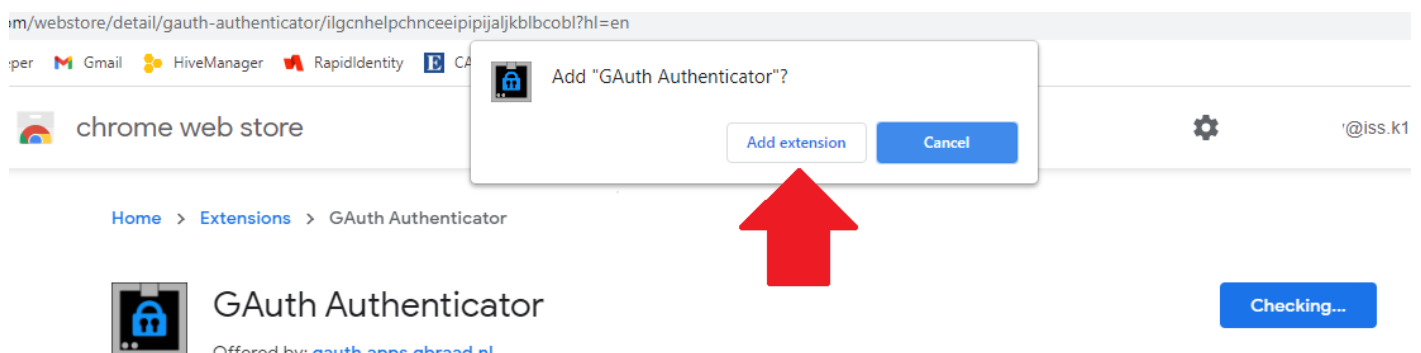


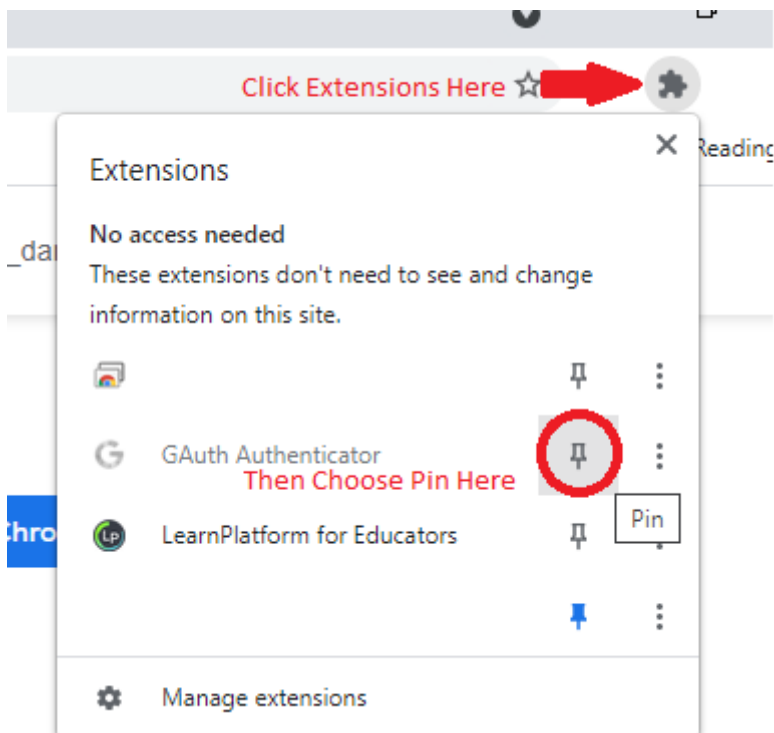
How to Setup GAuth Authenticator with Gmail

Please make sure you have enabled Two Factor Authenticator in Gmail. If this has not been done, please follow the instructions listed [here](#).

Step 1. Please add the Chrome Extension GAuth Authenticator by [clicking here](#) and click **Add to Chrome**. (Pictured Below)

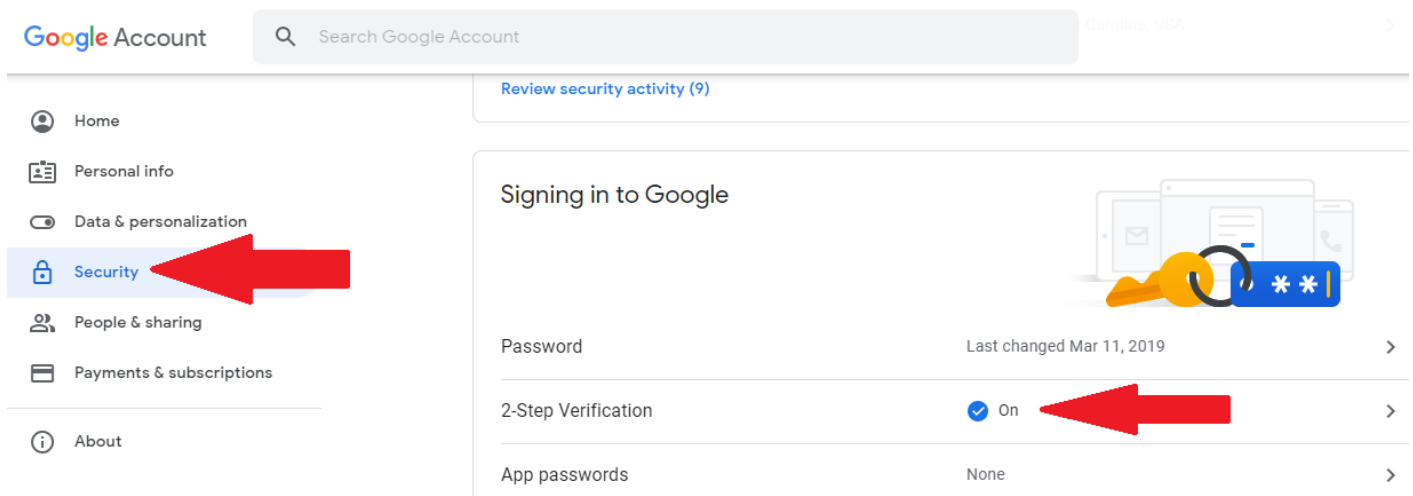


Step 2. In the Top Right Hand corner of the screen, choose the extensions icon that looks like a puzzle piece. After you click on that, then click on the thumbtack beside of GAuth Authenticator to Pin GAuth Authenticator. (Pictured Below)



Step 3. Go to <https://myaccount.google.com/>

Step. 4. Click **Security** on the left hand side of the screen, and then click where it says **On** beside 2-Factor Verification (Pictured below)





Step 5. Scroll down, and find where it says **Authenticator app** and then click **SET UP** (Photo Below)

A second step after entering your password verifies it's you signing in. [Learn more](#)

**Google prompts (Default)** 

After you enter your password, Google prompts are securely sent to every phone where you're signed in. Just tap the notification to review and sign in.
To stop getting prompts on a particular phone, sign out of that phone. [Learn more](#)


Note: If you sign in to your Google Account on any eligible phone, Google prompts will be added as another method for 2-Step Verification.

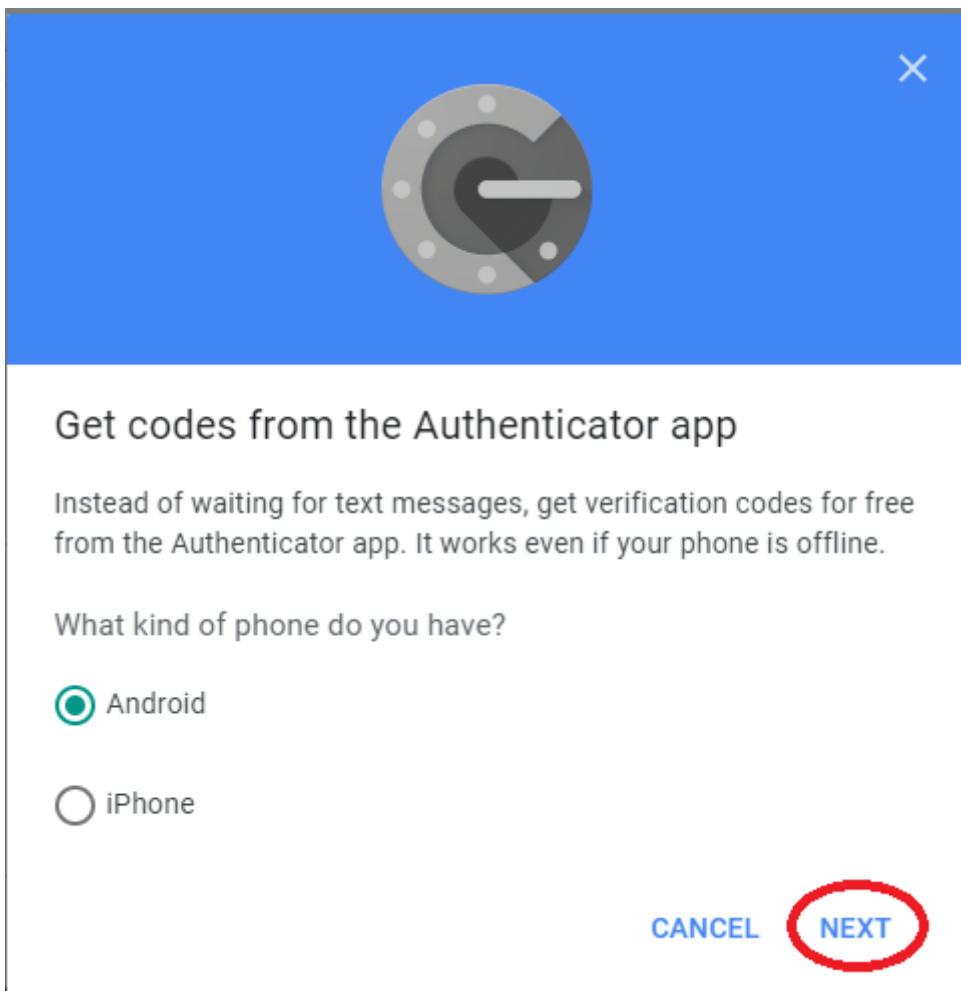
Set up additional backup steps so you can sign in even if your other options aren't available.

**Backup codes**
These printable one-time passcodes allow you to sign in when away from your phone, like when you're traveling.

**Authenticator app**
Use the Authenticator app to get free verification codes, even when your phone is offline.

**Security Key**
A security key is a verification method that allows you to securely sign in. These can be built in to your phone, use Bluetooth, or plug directly into your computer's USB port.

Step 6. You can leave the selection on Android, and then click Next. (Photo Below)



Step 7. On the next screen, you will Choose **Can't Scan It?** below the QR Code. (Photo Below)

- In the App select **Set up account**.
- Choose **Scan a barcode**.



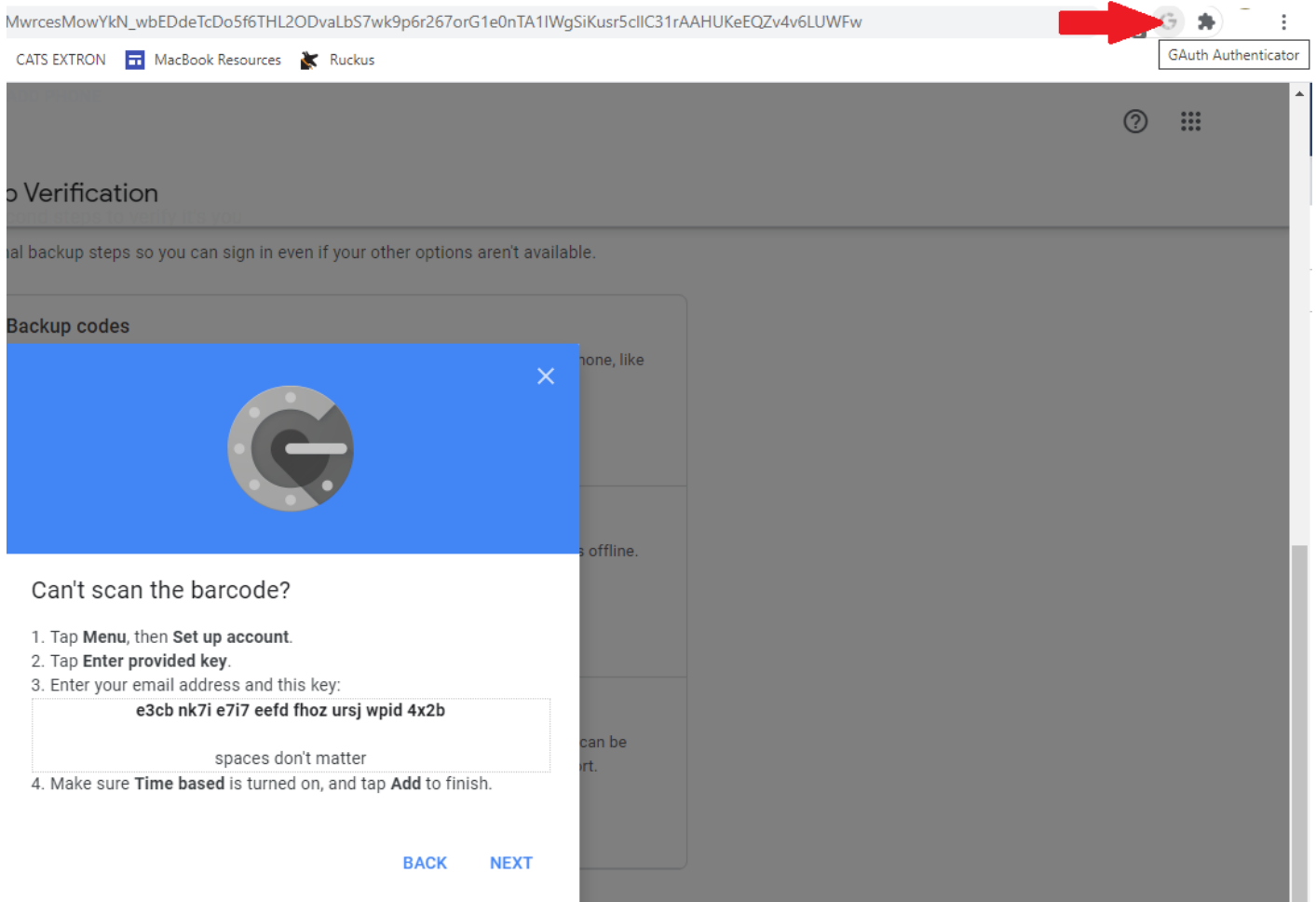

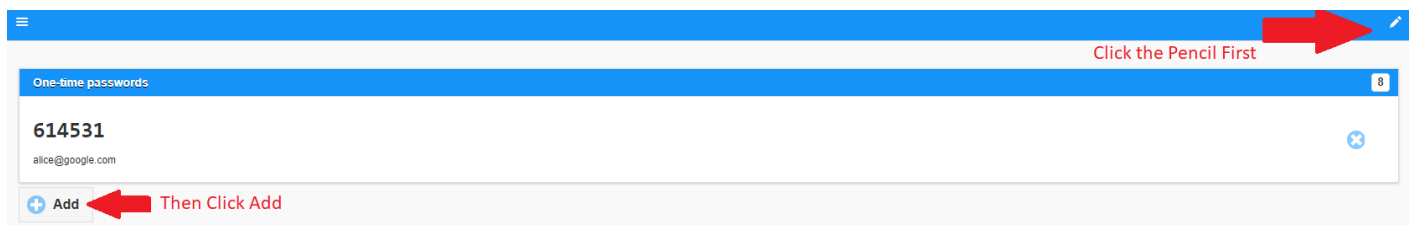

Step 8. Next you will Click on GAUTH Authenticator icon in the top right.



Step 9. On the next step, you will need to select the pencil in the top right, and then click Add. (Photo Below)



Step 10. You will then go to Add the Account - Make the **Account Name** Gmail or ISS Gmail, then you will have to go back to the Chrome tab that has the Key (from Step 8) and then paste it in the text box that says **Secret key** and then click Add.



Can't scan the barcode?

1. Tap **Menu**, then **Set up account**.
2. Tap **Enter provided key**.
3. Enter your email address and this key:

6wsk aipl 33rt fmgj rusp 5ude 2xuo 5skd
Copy and paste the code given to you
to your clipboard

4. Make sure **Time based** is turned on, and tap **Add** to finish.

Step 11. Copy the Code that GAuth Authenticator gives you, go back to the Google Accounts Page, and click Next and paste the code there and click verify.
